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From the Director's Desk

The pain and agony of COVID-19 that began in 2020 continued to instil fear in the following year. While looking back, we realise that the story of year 2021-22 unfurled with the increasing severity of Corona virus causing unprecedented death and loss. We practically spent the year 2021 under the fear of death, disruption and loss of life of someone or the other related to us.

However we didn't rest. On seeing people, begging for food, we intensified our Feed India - Protect India campaign, reaching out to people stranded at home. We received more than 400 calls on Child Line – 1098, where parents asked for food for their children. It was a sad situation everywhere. We partnered



with several organisations and corporates to reach out to people stranded across 14 states. Our Nutrition and Protection kits were always ready to be carried and delivered to people in need. There were complaints of abuse against women and children and we tried our best to address the same.

Apart from food and dry rations, we made available the lifesaving Oxygen cylinders and concentrators to people struggling for breath. With focus on migrant and minority communities, we moved swiftly to ease the pain and agony of thousands of people who waited for help and support during that critical time.

Our COVID response action also ensured uninterrupted online learning for the children and youth through Digital Bank initiative. They could access digital tools and could continue their studies while at home. We partnered with Jubilant Bhartia Foundation and launched the mobile HP-CLAP project in district Gautum Budh Nagar, U.P. Our aim is to equip each child with basic digital literacy skills. With support from District education department, we are reaching out to children studying in the community and government and low cost private schools. The project runs through a mobile van which is equipped with laptops and Wi-Fi service for practical teaching and learning experience to children across the district.

The year 2021 had been bad for humans. However, it has taught us a lot of lessons in strength and resilience. Drawing upon the learnings, we have continued to work with the feeling of Service Before Us.

ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

Social and Development Action and Research Group (SADRAG) is a not-for-profit organization, which was established in the year 2004. SADRAG works primarily in Delhi-NCR Region and in the state of U.P. and Haryana. It commenced its operation in southern India in 2012, when it launched an initiative to educate the migrant children in peri-urban communities of Bengaluru in Karnataka.

SADRAG envisions Inclusive Communities where people are educated, safe and have access to decent livelihood opportunities. It advocates for extensive research combined with community action as a solution for bringing about an equalitarian and qualitative change in communities. The organization empowers women, children and youth through training, capacity building and service delivery for their basic needs of education, health, skill development and livelihood.

The organization follows the Grassroots Implementation Model in convergence with stakeholders from various departments and disciplines. The organization has a deep rooted presence in the community and continues to maintain the trust and partnerships built therein.

The success of SADRAG is based on the scale of qualitative change brought about in human life through direct intervention, training and research.

SADRAG works on certain intrinsic values. These values constitute the core of the organization's existence.


THE OBJECTIVES:

- Collective strategy of research, training and action to bring about qualitative change in the life of vulnerable communities.
- Action research and praxis in development issues across economic and socio-cultural variables in rural and urban areas.
- Study the socio-cultural construct of 'gender' as prevalent and practised in Indian society.





- Dissemination and sharing of research findings among stakeholders, policymakers, academicians and social activists.
- Implementation of learnings drawn from action research to improve the quality of life of community youth, children and women.
- Working in the area of Child Welfare/Child Development/ Child Protection and Child Rights in rural and urban areas.



PROGRAMMES AND INITIATIVES

SADRAG primarily works in the following three domains:

• **Education:** We advocate for child rights that includes healthy and safe childhood, protection from abuse and formal school education. The interventions include the following programs:-

Ugta Suraj is the program to mainstream 'Out of School' children and to ensure that no child is deprived of his/her basic right to formal education that is granted under the Right to Education Act 2009.

Vidya Ratna is a full school scholarship awarded to migrant children who may otherwise be deprived of formal education due to economic constraints at home or challenging systematic process.



Life Skills Education is the program to empower adolescent youth through training life skills in necessary for a balance way of life.

Strengthening the Government School System enriches government schools by improving infrastructural facilities and qualitative resources for improved learning levels among the children.

- Protection from Abuse & Violence: We work for the protection of children, young girls and women through research, training and direct intervention in specific instances of abuse and violence. In partnership with Child Line India Foundation, we support and rescue children from distress situations through 1098, the 24 hours National Phone Helpline under the ICPS scheme of the Central Government. Our Safe City initiative is to build 'Zero tolerance to Violence against Women and young Girls' in private and public spaces. By educating women and young girls, stakeholders sensitization, safety audits and use of mobile phone technology, the program advocates for safe spaces and a gender-sensitized ecosystem through Institutionalized training on POSH, we advocate for diverse, inclusive and gender-sensitive workplaces. We are a part of the institutional mechanism for POSH at various organizations where we conduct gender sensitization training and address the ICC complaints.
- **Skill Development and Livelihood:** Through training in skill development, we work for women and youth through Self Help Groups (SHGs), direct job placement, promotion of micro-economic enterprises in rural and peri-urban areas. We provide skill training through periodical courses which have technical as well as non-technical components such as career guidance, soft skills, financial literacy etc.
- **Community Development:** We work in rural and peri-urban communities to create facilities and provide services in the area of literacy, health and livelihood meant to improve quality of life of local population.
- Action Research & Training: We conduct research on socially relevant issue such as child Labour, Child Protection, Literacy & Education, Violence against Women, Gender and Livelihood etc. These are learning opportunities for us to generate knowledge for planning, implementation and monitoring of grassroots programs initiated by us.



Ugta Suraj for a Literate Childhood

Ugta Suraj is the program to mainstream "out of school" children in the spirit of Right to Education 2009. The program has been operational in Noida since August 2007. With firm roots in the community, Ugta Suraj operates through a Network of Learning and Support Centers (LSCs) for children who are working/non-working, migrant/street or the potential child workers in times to come. Ugta Suraj is meant for children in the age group 6 to 14 years. It is essentially a bridge between the formal school system and the community. It prepares the children for formal schooling and helps their enrollment in the government, private and charitable schools.

Ugta Suraj provides alternate options and opportunities for learning by children through-

- Preparation for formal school system.
- Empowerment through life skills education.
- Orientation on values of leadership, Gender Sensitization & Citizenship.

Ugta Suraj centers are presently functional in 3 communities: Village Nithari, Village Nagla Charandas in Noida and in Village Tughalpur in Greater Noida. These centers have children from the migrant community. While their parents struggle livelihood, the school education of their children remains neglected.

During the year 2021-22, a total of 105 children were enrolled in Ugta Suraj Centres, Out of which 58% comprised the girls who were otherwise stranded at home for the care of younger sibling and household tasks.



During 2021-22, Ugta Suraj children were introduced to S.L.A.T.E. (Simple Learning Activities to Think and empower), a new teaching learning experience. S.L.A.T.E. is conceptualized and developed by Vaishali Gupta, an Educationist and Founder of One Teacher One Scientist, to provide experiential learning to children from disadvantaged communities.

VIDYA RATNA

Vidya Ratna is a school scholarship program for children from migrant communities. The program was launched in 2008 for the support of formal school education of Underprivileged children till the completion of higher secondary school.

The Vidya Ratna children have been enrolled in Noida Public Senior Secondary School, Noida since Class II. We provide the year round support for school fees, uniform, text books and stationary requirements of the children. They are also provided regular after school support to cope with the school subjects.


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Out of the total of 13 Vidya Ratna children, Sakshi studying in Class XII and would complete the higher secondary school in 2021-22. Out of the remaining children, Five are in Class X and kashish is in Class IX. During 2020-21, COVID-19 impacted their school studies a lot. The schools were physically closed and the teachers restored to online teaching. This was a very new experience for children who suffered due to the inadequacies and inequities of formal education system. The lack of digital devices for online learning constrained their learning.

Ms. Saumya Parthasarthy, Founder, Movement Positive programs Bengaluru, offered social-emotional experiential learning to children through art, dialogue and self-reflection. SAMPARC A Program for Street Children

• SAMPARC transforms children's lives

After days of mobilising the street children, a mega Convergence Camp was organised at Old Usmanpur, Second Pushta in NE Delhi on 11 March 2022. The various stakeholders such as CWC, MSK, DURCC, CRCC, EDMC, WCD, DCPUC, Delhi police, health department, CDO and Civil defence converged with their resources and linkages to mainstream the street children. Around 168 children and 60 families, availed the services and had the benefit of school enrolment, registration in Anganwadi centres and Health Check-ups. On the spot ration were facilitated by department officials.

Sarthak Livelihood Program for Youth

Sarthak is a program for migrant & marginalized youth that augments their skill development and income generation capacity through sustainable career options. We have been working in the livelihood field since 2015 and have skilled around 1200 youth in the contemporary sectors such as Graphic & Print Design, Retail Management and IT industry.

Sarthak center is located in Village Naya Bans, Noida. The training programmes span over Basic Computer literacy, Life & Soft Skills, Finance Literacy, Graphic & Print Design, ICT and IT Sectors. It aims to improve the lives of youth from vulnerable and marginalized segments. These unemployed youth with a minimum educational qualification of Class X in the age group 16 to 28 years. Equipped with all necessary facilities including laptops, projector, printer, Bluetooth Sound Device and broadband service, the Sarthak center offers free computer literacy Programme, career counselling sessions, Employee engagement program, exposure visits and many more.

• Financial Literacy: A Must for Youth

Ms. Vinita Arora, Co-founder, Wealth Wings, a dedicated financial consultancy company conducted a series of online sessions with Sarthak youth on the concept of Money and its genesis. The youth learnt the functions of money and the various options available to save their limited money resources.

SARTHAK: Skill Development for Migrant Women

The migrant women are, by and large, devoid of marketable skills that may fetch them decent livelihood They are forced to work as domestic help for basic cleaning, washing and cooking in private homes.

To skill these women, Sarthak program was launched in 2009 in peri-urban communities of District Gautum Budh Nagar and Hapur in the state of U.P. Such women are today running their own micro-enterprises and have been instrumental in getting their family wriggle out of poverty.

Since 2009, a total of 300 women and young girls have been skilled in vocation like beauty culture, artificial jewelry making, stitching & tailoring, paper bag making, etc. These women were encouraged to build micro-level enterprises. Sarthak has reached the women in village Nithari, Nwada, Rasoolpur, Agahpr, Harola and Nayabans over the years.

The Resource Group for Sarthak for Women is **Roshni: Lioness Club**, Noida which is the women wing of Lions Club.

• Sarthak was re-launched in village Nithari on 1 April 2021. These women live in village Nithari and work as part-time domestic helper in the neighborhood residential complex. The three months Sarthak course began with making of face masks for the protection of self and family from COVID-19.

Bridging the Digital Gap

Continued Learning Access Project (HP CLAP)

To bridge the exisiting digital divide, we partnered with Jubilant Bhartia Foundation to children in digital skills. We launched the Continued Learning Access Project (HP CLAP) program in District Gautam Budh Nagar to train children in the community, government schools and low cost private schools. We have made an MOU with Education Department, District Gautam Budh Nagar for the coverage of all 500+ government schools over the next five years.

HP CLAP has a mobility van equipped with 120 Google Chrome books. It has a generator for power and also a UPS Inverter for power backup and laptop charging facility. The covers number of schools as per the predefined schedule.

Child Protection

During the second phase of COVID-19, violence prevention and response services for children were severely disrupted. However we continued to work an ground and extended all possible support to children.

During the year 2021-22, Child Line Greater Noida team assisted 682 children in need. The team members were on foot for 24 hours a day to help children who were in need of food, milk, and support. We addressed around 362 calls on Child Help Line 1098. These were distress calls for food, rations and milk for the children. The other calls were for education resources, medical help, physical and sexual abuse and missing lost child.

The Child Line response was swift despite restrictions on physical movement. Besides direct intervention for support to children, we managed to organise programs for awareness on child protection issues.

COVID-19 Emergency Response

The people in our communities, being the migrants, were without food and money. Their fragile savings were exhausted and they were forced to borrow for their basic sustenance. Our instant action was to provide nutrition and protection kits to migrant families stranded in their little dwellings. We provided dry rations, milk, drinking water, protective masks, soaps and hand sanitizers to the community, child homes, government hospitals and Anganwadi centers.

Our work in the community continued with the mission to feed and protect women, children and their families during COVID-19.

Nutrtion & Protection Kits

From March 2020 onwards, we were engaged in COVID-19 relief work. Our aim was to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 and lockdown crisis among low income groups and migrant community. Our endeavor has been to -

- Solve hunger crisis and ease distress during the pandemic
- Prevent and Protect vulnerable from contracting the Corona virus
- Nourish and protect children and prevent child wasting
- Facilitate online learning for children and youth who could not access and afford digital tools
- Restore and organize online lessons for youth for an undisrupted learning
- Help and support to children from abuse and violence
- Fill Information Gap on issues affecting children, women and youth through online education, webinars and interactive talks.



• Nourishing & Protecting the Vulnerable:

The children can counter COVID-19 if they are well nourished and protected against COVID-19. A total of 14326 Nutrition and Protection kits (NPKs) were distributed with each kit carrying the items essential for nourishment and protection from COVID-19. The quality of food items was tested by the Food and Quality Control Department, District Gautam Budh Nagar, U.P.

The Nutrition and Protection Kits were distributed among slum dwellers and migrant laborers across District Gautam Buddh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh and in slum areas of Delhi and Gurugram in Haryana. These were the families who had lost their jobs and means of livelihood. They had no money to buy food. It was a common sight to see women and children begging for food on the streets which were incidentally empty due to lockdown.

We reached to over 314638 beneficiaries with food, rations and protective gears from Corona. These included daily wage laborers, small time vendors, pregnant and lactating women, orphan/deserted children, differently abled people, elderly people, women headed households and migrant workers in Delhi-NCR region including the industrial towns of Noida, Greater Noida and Dadri in U.P. and pockets of Delhi and Gurugram in Haryana. Each Kit provided food for nourishment and items of personal protection from Corona.

 Mere distribution may not work unless the use of medical essentials such as the Thermometer, intake of essential supplements Zinc and Vitamin C, fever reducing tablets-Paracetamol, hand hygiene with soap and hand sanitizers, proper wearing of face masks are explained to people. That's exactly what our Child Line Greater Noida Warriors team does to ensure optimum utilization of Life Kits.



<u>Use of Life Kit is explained for optimum utilization</u>

• Despaired faces lit up when our team reached at the dilapidated jhuggi - jhopri colony at Dadri. The local police at Dadri joined us in the distribution drive. While Food and medical essentials were distributed among the locals, sub-inspector Preeti Chahal, Thana Dadri spoke to those who were seen without the masks and gave them the masks to wear.





• In support of Domestic Helps

We distributed Food Kits among the domestic helps and their children in Sector-55, Noida. During CVID-19, the domestic workers were debarred from work in private homes. Their homes suffered with loss of livelihood. Now that the women are called for work, their husbands are still without work. Their children have been the voiceless sufferers in these circumstances.



• If we could make them Happy

COVID-19 has brought human life to a standstill. The sex workers at G.B. Road in Delhi suffered with no work and no money. Social stigma, as it is, takes a heavy toll on these women. COVID-19 brought distress and pain in their as well as their children's life.





• It's difficult to smile in difficult times. Isn't it

But Baba ji could not resist a smile when he received the Food Kit at Daya Basti near Sarai Rohalla railway station. Daya Basti is where Coolies and Helpers live with their families. Since railways stopped during the lock down, these people had to dig in their tiny savings and borrowed money from where ever they could.





• Reaching the Un reached

A Cluster of more than 100 Jhuggies near Ashok Nagar, Delhi has people who either beg for money or pick trash on the roads. The most impoverished segment, live like Pariahs within the circle of their own people. We hope that our Ration Kit would feed the family and their children for a month. They would not have to sleep hungry at night.



• Covid had Severely Hit the Domestic Helps

Paid domestic help is the backbone of Urban Households. Due to COVID-19, the Domestic Helps were not allowed in residential colonies. They lost their livelihood overnight and were stranded in their rented homes. On 15 August 2021, we distributed Food and Protection Kits to domestic helps with the message of Food Security this Independence Day. Raj Rani, President, RWA Sector - 55, Noida facilitated the Distribution Drive in her locality.





• Our Feed India Protect India Campaign Continues

Our Child Line Greater Noida team reaches village Piyavali in NTPC, Dadri where people work in fields as causal labor. The team educated the community on Child Line services available in GB Nagar for children in distress. They distributed Dry Ration Kits to women present there. Each Kit has sufficient wheat flour, rice, sugar, cooking oil, Dalia and pulses to last 25 days for a family of four members.



• Life Paused as Railways Stopped

The life of Porters and Sanitary workers at Ghaziabad railway station catapulted as soon as the nationwide lock down was announced last year. There was no public movement and trains were stationed in their tracks. It was misery of life for these workers. Now that COVID-19 situation has eased and the railways are functioning, these workers are back to the struggle of food, work and life. We joined the struggles of Coolies and sanitary workers and distributed Dry Ration Kits among them to provide for their food security.

• India is Their Home

Delhi has a sizable population of afghan refugees who are now settled here in India. COVID-19 has added distress in the shattered lives of many. We distributed 200 Nutrition and Protection kits among Afghan women and youth, many of whom have suffered the agony of COVID-19. Their stories of life reminds of the pain of separation, helplessness and hunger.





• Sweeti's agony of Covid-19

Sweeti, 22 years is lives with her family in a slum cluster in Sector-4, Noida. She has three brothers, sister-in-law and an ailing mother. COVID times showed them the darkest times as they lost their father. The father was struggling with shortness of breath and needed oxygen. her brothers carried him to the hospital but couldn't admit him. The father died within two hours.. Soon after the father died, the eldest son was thrown out of job. The other son faced huge economic loss for not getting any work.

The wounds had not even healed when Sweeti's mother was admitted in a hospital. She was in the ICU as her situation was very critical. The family took a loan of 5,00,000 INR.

The seventeen years old Sandhya from Village Kheda in Badalpur, GB Nagar had appeared for her Intermediate school exams. She wanted to study in a college and build her future. When she came to know that her father was marrying her off to a semi-literate youth from Kasna on 18 July 2021. She gathered courage and called for help at 1098.

The Child Line Greater Noida team immediately swung into action. Together with Police: Badalpur, they rescued Sandhya and saved a bright future from getting wasted in the tangles of child marriage.

We convinced enrolled Vani in MCD primary school. The younger children are enrolled in Anganwadi centre. Vani and her family were linked to Aadhaar Cards now.






• Thanks CLAP for Khushi to be Khush

Khushi studies in Class VIII in KCS Girls Inter College, a low cost private school in Greater Noida. Her school studies had miserably suffered during the pandemic. The family had no means to buy a computer. She used her father's smart phone to access the school lessons but this opportunity was neither regular nor persistent.

Under CLAP, when Khushi held a laptop, she placed it upside down. When she clicked a key, she was nervous and hesitant. After persistent training, Khushi learnt not only the correct technique of using the laptop but also learnt to use the internet for information and knowledge.





Seven years old Arshad got lost while playing with his friends near his house. He accidentally got into a tempo, without knowing where he was going. The tempo was giving toward railway station, Dadri. When asked about his name and address, he was too scared to inform where he lived.

After hours of searching for his home, the Railway GRPF, called Child Line at 1098. The Child Line Greater Noida team reached and counselled Arshad so as to comfort him. Slowly with the help of the area police, Arshad was restored to his parents, who were daily wage labourers. Arshad hugged his father when he saw him.
