

FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK......

The year 2022-23 was the healing year for humanity. The people all over the world were struggling to overcome the pain and agony of COVID-19 and so were we. We were involved in re-building the lives of those who had suffered during the pandemic, particularly the ones who had lost people related closely to them. The women who lost their family members and the children who lost their parents were the most vulnerable since there was no one to provide them food, money and care. We reached out to them through Child Line 1098 and community networks with food. shelter linkages with government schemes for sustainability. At the same time, we resumed our field programms and began in-person engagements more pro-actively.

While on one hand, HP-CLAP continued to empower school and community children with digital literacy, on the other, Ugta Suraj continued to equip children with essential knowledge and skills as a part of formal school preparation. Sarthak for youth and livelihood program went ahead with training of migrant youth in marketable skills required by local manufacturing, retail and IT companies. Sarthak





for women and livelihood program made strides in the area of environmental sustainability based on the premise of Recycle and Reuse. Apart from gaining mastery over stitching and tailoring, they used old and torn clothes to make attractive bags of differerent sizes and patterns. This was their endeavour to contribute to environemt as well as earning an income for the family.

Over the years, we have been actively engaged in the area of gender based violence through direct implementatiom, research and training. The year 2022 was the year for strengthening the redressal mechanism of gender based violence through training and capacity building of service providers. We onboarded with UN Women South Asia office for a collaborative project on gender based violence. Spread over the states of Tamil Nadu, Punjab and U.P., we trained around 1000 ground functionaries on the redressal mechanism of gender based violence. The aim was to build their capacities to provide an efficient addressal and right based response to gender based violence.

During recent years, the challenges on ground have increased multifold. However we have been relentlessly moving ahead with new ideas while strengthening the existing interventions on ground. In our journey, the role of volunteers has been very crucial. We would like to thank them as well as the host of college and university interns for their unconditional support and ownership in all our endeavours.

Ending on a happy note, we received the prestigious Mahatma Award for social good and contribution to quality of education. The award is instituted by the Aditya Birla Group of Industries.

The Objectives

Our Objectives reflect the collective strategy of research, training and action to bring about sustainable change in the life of vulnerable communities. The main objectives are to:

Work in the area of literacy and education by mainstreaming out of school children. Supporting government school system, empowering children throughart & creativity. Life skills education and digital innovations in education.

Work on gender issues with an integrated approach comprising research, training and direct intervention. These would be broadly covered under the thematic areas of poverty, work & livelihood, health, violence, power and decision making, rights & entitlements, media, environment and the girl child.

Study the socio-cultural construct of "gender" as prevalent and practiced in Indian society and construct intervention models on women safety and prevention from abuse.

Work in the area of Child Welfare\Child Development Child Protection and Child Rights in rural and urban areas.

Implement lessons drawn from action research for improving the quality of life of underprivileged children, youth and community women.

Conduct action research in development issues in the context of changing economic and socio-cultural variables. The issues would broadly pertain to gender, environment, health, education and micro credit in rural as well as urban areas.

SADRAG works on certiain intrinsic values that form its existence, functioning and way forward.

Our Values





Programs and Initiatives

SADRAG primarily works in the following domains:

Child Rights and Education The program advocates for the rights of child to health, safety, protection from abuse, play and formal school education through following grassroots interventions:

- 1. Ugta Suraj is the program to mainstream Out of School children to ensure that no child is deprived of her/his basic right to education that has been granted under the Right to Education Act, 2009.
- 2. Vidya Ratna is a full scholarship programme for migrant children to pursue their school education.
- 3.Jeevan Ki Samajh is the program to empower adolescent youth through life skills
- education and guidance.
- 4.Strengthening Government School System Program improves infrastructural facilities and adds qualitative resources in schools so as to improve the attendance and learning levels of children.

Our Values



Protection from Abuse & Violence: In partnership with Child Line India Foundation, the organisation supports and rescues children in distress through 1098, the 24 hours National Phone Helpline under the ICPS-Vatsalya scheme of the Central Government. Besides direct intervention and support, the organisation conducts research, training and generates awareness to strengthen the existing prevention and redressal mechanism on violence against children.

Our work on gender based violence advocates for zero tolerance of violence against women and young girls. We build capacity of stakeholders such as Notice, Judiciary, health workers and their ground functionaries to prevent and respond to gender based violence at home and in public spaces. Through awareness and training on POSH, we emphasize the need to establish diverse and inclusive workplaces. Being a member of institutional mechanism for POSH at various organisations, we address formal complaints of sexual harassment at workplace according to The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013.

Skill Development and Livelihood: We promote economic sustainability of women and youth through skilling, Self-Help Groups (SHGs) and direct job placement in rural and urban areas.

Community Development: We work in rural and urban communities to create basic infrastructure, facilities and provide services for literacy, health and livelihood meant to improve the quality of life of local people.

Action Research & Training: We conduct research on contemperory social issues such as child labour, child protection, literacy & education, violence against women, gender and livelihood etc. The research outcomes provide knowledge for planning, implementation and monitoring of various programmes initiated by the organisation.



Ugta Suraj: Towards Literate Childhood

Ugta Suraj is a a bridge between formal school system and the community. It prepares migrant children between 6 to 14 years for sustained formal schooling under RTE Act 2009.

Ugta Suraj mainstreams "out of school" children through formal school system in district Gautum Budh Nagar, U.P. While the families of these children have migrated and settled here for livelihood, the school education of the children is grossly neglected. Ugta Suraj fills this void in their life. With firm roots in the community, Ugta Suraj operates through a Network of Learning and Support Centers (LSCs) for children who are working/non-working, migrant/ street or are the potential child workers. These children are either school drop-outs or are first generation learners who have been deprived of formal schooling for either family or systemic reasons..

Ugta Suraj disrupts the deprivation of life for children and their parents through alternate opportunities of learning such as:

Preparation for formal school system

Empowerment through life skills education
Inculcation of leadership, gender sensitization & citizenship
Escaping from child rights abuses such as child labour, child marriage & violence

Ugta Suraj centers are presently functional in 3 communities: Village Nithari and Village Nagla Charandas in Noida and in Village Tugalpur in Greater Noida.

During 2022-23, a total of 125 children were enrolled in the three Ugta Suraj Centres. Out of 125 childre, 74 were girls. These gils were stranded at home for the care of younger siblings and household tasks. Ugta Suraj provided them an opportunity to learn and grow.

Ugta Suraj children continued to follow S.L.A.T.E. (Simple Learning Activities to Think and Empower) curriculm for an innovative learning experience. S.L.A.T.E. is conceptualized and developed by Ms. Vaishali Gupta, an Educationist and Founder of One Teacher One Scientist. SLATE provides an experiential learning experience to Ugta Suraj children

A total of 125 children wee enrolled in Ugta Surja Centres in 2022-23. Out of it, 116 children were enrolled in formal school system in the beginning of the year 2023. About 58% of these children were girls, with a majority being in the age group of 6 to 10 years. Ugta Suraj had motivated these girls and their parents so much that they volunteered to enroll them in school.

The children enrolled for school session 2023-24 would be monitored and followed up for a period of one year. They would be provided all possible support.



School enrollments begin:

Early April of the year 2023 and Ugta Suraj teachers and children rush to neighborhood schools their admissions. Having learnt the basics at Ugta Suraj centres, the children from Nithari, Nagla and Tughalpur centres appeared for entrance exam conducted by the schools.

Community Outreach for Ugta Suraj 2023-24

The session for Ugta Suraj 2022-23 formally commenced in June 2022. It followed the conduct of a community survey in and around village Nagla, Nithari and Tughalpur whereby, the out of school children from migrant communities, were identified, and their parents were mobilised to send them to Ugta Suraj Center. A total of 220 out of school children were identified across the three locations.

During 2022-23, our work in CSR partnership with RMSI spanned over two major interventions:

Infrastructural improvement of school building & existing facilities particularly those which

were damaged in lockdown during the pandemic.

Psycho-social support to children to help them overcome the agony and grief faced during

first and second waves of Covid.

(i) Prevention of Water Borne Diseases

An RO enabled water cooler was installed in the school for a regular supply of safe drinking water to around 500 children studying in the school.





To address this problem, two pits of 15-20 feet in depth were to store the rain water. It helped to mitigate flooding in low lying areas and contributed to optimum maintenance of groundwater level.



Vidya Ratna





Vidya Ratna is the school scholarship program for children from migrant communities. The program was launched in the year 2008 for the support of formal school education till higher secondary level. The Vidya Ratna children have been enrolled in Noida Public Senior Secondary School, Noida since Class II. We meet the year round requirements such as school fees, uniform, text books and stationary required for studies. The children are also provided after school support to help cope with the school subjects.











Over the years, while 12 of the children have passed Class XII and are now engaged in multiple activities such as college education, informal/formal sector employment etc.

In 2022-23, Gaurish was promoted to class XI. He had cleared the Class X Board examination with flying colours. Another child, Kashish was also promoted to class XI. Other children such as Radha, Krishna, Neha and Zainub joined National Institute of Open School (NIOS) to complete Class X. They droopped out of regular school for reasons associated with family and its compulsions.

Overcoming Adversity: Gaurish's Inspirational Journey to Success



Fighting against odds has never been easy for Gaurish. Since his father's demise, about 10 years back, Agahpur, a peri-urban village in Noida has been the home for Gaurish and his family members. Had it not been for his maternal uncle that Gaurish would have dropped out of school long time back.

Gaurish's high score of 90.2% in Class X boards exams is attributed to his hard work, dedication and high goals in life.

We wish Gaurish for his ongoing journey and beyond!



Sarthak is the program for migrant & marginalized youth to build their skill base and income generation capacity. We have been working in livelihood space since 2015 and have skilled around 2000 youth for contemporary sectors such as Graphic & Print Design, Tally Retail Management and IT industry.

Sarthak center is located in village Naya Bans, Noida. It aims to improve the lives of youth between 18 to 25 year and with a minimum formal school qualification of Class X. Equipped with all necessary facilities including laptops, projector, printer, Bluetooth Sound Device and broadband service, the Sarthak center offers free computer literacy Programme, career counselling sessions, Employee engagement program, exposure visits and many more.

Sarthak program has the following key components:

1.**Technical Training:** It provides comprehensive technical training on skill development, ICT, and entrepreneurial development. It enhances digital competencies of the youth, to keep

them well-informed about the latest technology and advancements

- 2.**Soft Skills and Personality Development:** It emphasizes the development of communication and interpersonal skills, vital for success in today's competitive world.
- 3. **Financial Literacy:** It provides knowledge and skills in money management, savings, investment opportunities, and digital payments.

In our commitment to SDG-8, Decent Work & Economic Growth, we have been providing market aligned skills to youth. During 2022-23, a total of 125 youth were trained in diverse skills of required for the contemperory industry. While 15 youth were trained in graphic designing, 80 were trained in basic computer operations and 15 were trained in tally accounting software. Of the total, around 40% of the youth were girls in the age group of 18 to 22 years. A batch of 35 youth from migrant communities, completed their training in technical skills, soft skills, financial literacy. They were provided career guidance by industry stalwarts.




Sarthak for Women programme is currently running at village Nithari in Noida. There is a centre in the community that provides a three months course in stitching and tailoring to 15 migrant women. These are migrant women, who lack skilling, literacy and alternate livelihood options. They work as domestic help in private homes. An element of environmental sustainability was added in Sarthak during 2022-23. The women began an endeavour to recycle old clothes into reusable cotton and silk bags for everyday use.

Each bag they create, is a testament to their creativity, expertise, and attention to detail. With every stitch and pattern, they infuse a touch of their unique committments creating products that are not only functional but also carry a story.

Continued Learning Access Project (CLAP) Noida is a CSR initiative powered by Hewlett Packard (HP) and Jubilant Bhartia Foundation (JBF). HP CLAP has a mobility Van loaded with 120 laptops Google Chrome books. It has a generator for power and also a UPS inverter for power backup and laptop charging facility.

It covers children from economically weaker sections and low-income strata with no access to digital device. The CLAP initiative provides computers to these communities and schools on a rotation basis. The motive is to reach every child in school and in the community and educate them about the computer, its functions, and conduct computer-based training.

Child Line under the Integrated Child Protection Scheme, is a 24 hours Helpline for children in distress. It is initiated by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India. We are the implementing partner in Greater Noida and Dadri.

Since inception in 2011, we have provided support to over 3302 children in need for medical care, rescue from child labor, violence and abuse, restoration to parents, tracked missing children and admitting them in safe child homes. During the year 2022-23, Child Line Greater Noida team assisted 402 children in need. We addressed around 330 calls on Child Help Line 1098.

In 2022, during the last phase of pandemic, there were still distress calls received for food, rations and milk for children. The other calls were for education resources, medical help, physical and sexual abuse and missing lost child. The Child Line response was swift despite restrictions on physical movement. Besides direct intervention for support to children, we organised a few programs for awareness on child protection issues in the community.



Let the children not bear the brunt of domestic violence

32 years old Puja was left high and dry when her husband, last month, forced her to leave home along with her two daughters; 5 years and 7 years old. There was domestic violence at home and the children had to bear it all. Taking some courage, Puja moved into a rented room. Child Line Greater Noida provided dry rations at their home. It tried to join Puja with a government welfare scheme to provide sustainable support to her children.





NOIDA: A two-day workshop was held in Noida for personnel deployed at the One Stop Centres (OSC), popularly known as Sakhi, across 18 districts of western Uttar Pradesh on Wednesday and Thursday.

Sakhis support women affected by any sort of violence with specialised services such as medical, legal and counselling assistance. It also acts as a temporary shelter for women who may have escaped violence at home and do not have any other place to go till the time a safe home is provided to them.

According to the Gautam Budh Nagar district probationary officer (DPO), the women and child development department of Uttar Pradesh government directed the workshop in a letter to the DPOs of 20 districts

on November 4. of which 18 participated. The districts included Moradabad, Bijnor. Rampur. Amroha. Sambhal. Meerut, Bulandshahr, Ghaziabad. Hapur, Baghpat. Gautam Budh Nagar, Saharanpur. Muzaffarnagar, Shamli, Agra, Mainpuri, Mathura, Firozabad, Kasganj and Auraiya. The workshop was held in Sector 62 and was carried out by personnel of Noida-based non-governmental organization

(NGO) Sadrag (Social Action and Development Research Action Group) and UN Women. New Delhi. These personnel are the first responders to victums coming to the centre and hence sensitising them about gender-based violence, how to approach the victim and how to assist them, is of prime importance, said Atul Soni, Gautam Budh Nagar DPO.

Mala Bhandari, founder of Sadrag NGO, said. "The personnel were trained in how to address the survivors, case management, providing support through coordination with other departments such as medical, legal state authorities and police," Bhandari said.

DPO Soni said on an average.

40 women on a monthly basis.
