

One morning, during the P.T. class in school, Sonu and Monu noticed a child outside the school gate.




He was repeating the exercises that the P.T. Sir and children were doing.

Monu felt very bad for that child and he said to Sonu




Look! that child wants to do P.T.

exercises like us."








I will go home and talk to my mother as well.

We will enrol Bhikku in our Ugta Suraj Center.






Major Laws on Child Rights in India


- 1. Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Act (amended in 2015)

- 3. Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act 2012 (POCSO)
- 4. Child and Adolescent Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986. (amended in 2016)
- 5. Right to Education Act 2009


What Makes Sonu Monu Comics unique!!


- 1. Engaging Stories: Short and precise stories narrated through colorful & vibrant pictures & easy to follow language

- 5. Freely Accessible: The comics are available as free online resource that is accessible to all.


